PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

As the first step of contemplated Sacramento Campus development, UCDH plans to develop the Mobility Hub at the intersection of clinical, education, research and Aggie Square components of the campus. The Mobility Hub is envisioned to include safe, convenient transportation connectivity for the Sacramento Campus.

The selected firm will must demonstrate expertise in the services contemplated to design the project as described in the Request for Qualifications and is expected to sign an Executive Design Professional Agreement that will include lump sum fees for provision of all basic services from Schematic Design (30%) through Construction Administration.

All statements of qualifications must be received no later than <u>4:00 PM, Friday, November 30, 2018</u>, at the above address. Firms may deliver their materials to the above address or mail them sufficiently in advance of the due date to ensure delivery and receipt by the required time and date. Statements of qualifications will be reviewed by University staff and a short list of firms will be invited to interviews. Every effort will be made to ensure that all persons have equal access to contracts and other business opportunities with the University within the limits imposed by law or University policy. The successful firm and their subconsultants will be required to follow the nondiscrimination requirements set forth in the Agreement documents and to pay prevailing wages at the location of the work. The work described in the Agreement is a public work subject to section 1771 of the California Labor Code.

Consultant/Design Professional shall pay all persons providing services and/or any labor on site, including any University location, no less than UC Fair Wage (defined as \$13 per hour as of 10/01/2015, \$14 per hour as of 10/01/2016, and \$15 per hour as of 10/01/2017) and shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local working condition requirements..
